* We do not designate full and part time students: whereas it generally takes a full-time student 7 full semesters to complete the program, this is not a mandatory plan of study. Therefore, to account for both full and part time students, we use a 5 year bench-mark from start to completion.

** Based on 2013 scores, these pass rates represent those who passed the exam on their first attempt.

*** The National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC) provides the State of Florida with exam pass rate information. In 2013, 54 UCF alumni took the National Clinical Mental Health Counselors Exam (NCMHCE) and 37 passed on their first attempt. As a comparison, for the entire state of Florida, the first time pass rate of all test-takers in 2013 was 60%.

**** The Association of Marital and Family Therapists Regulatory Boards (AMFTRB) does not provide the State of Florida with exam pass rate information. The last time that the State Licensing Board was able to determine exam pass rates was in 2011. As a comparison, for the entire state of Florida, the first time pass rate of all test-takers in 2011 was 50%.

***** Students in the School Counseling track must pass their state qualifying exams during their internships and cannot graduate until they do so. Thus all students who graduate from the School Counseling track have passed their state qualifying exams.
